
















## Carter County 4-H Youth Development

To whom it may concern,

Hello, my name is Rebecca Hayes, and I am the Carter County 4-H Youth Development Agent. 4-H is the largest youth organization and serves almost all youth in Carter County. I currently visit all the 4<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms and five of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms in Carter County. The 4-H program also reaches over 200 youth outside of the school setting. 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



## **County Fair**
